





#### One example: compatibility linting

Q: Do you use a service to test your code across browsers?





Q: Why don' t you use existing tools to test across browsers?

They take too much time	19.7%
They are too expensive	27.9%
They are too complicated	23.0%
It's too much work to write test code	31.2%
Don't have time to learn to use them	44.3%
Don't agree with their business practices (e.g., closed-source)	21.3%
They don't provide the browser coverage I need	14.8%
They don't fit into my workflow	41.0%
Other	16.4%



#### How can you help?

- Watch for public release of read/write API
- Use the public write API or the public contribution UI to add compatibility data
- Build your own tools taking advantage of this public API
- Talk about it; help make it authoritative and great
